The position in accordance with Section 28 subsection 3 of the Hamburg higher education act (Hamburgisches Hochschulgesetz, HmbHG) commences on April 1, 2021.

This is a fixed-term contract in accordance with Section 2 of the academic fixed-term labor contract act (Wissenschaftszeitvertragsgesetz, WissZeitVG). The term is fixed for a period of 3 years. The position calls for 75 % of standard work hours per week**.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

Duties include academic services in the project named above. Research associates may also pursue independent research and further academic qualifications and project results may be used in the context of doctorate.

SPECIFIC DUTIES:

Research in the frame of the Cluster’s research field ‘Archiving Artefacts’ with a focus on archives and/or archival history and practices in East Asia. The position includes the enrolment in the Graduate School and requires participation in research colloquia, lecture series and workshops, as well as active engagement in the Cluster's research activities.

REQUIREMENTS:

A university degree in a relevant field. Preferred is a degree in history or East Asian studies with a focus on archival history and/or the development of archives. Experience in working with archives and manuscripts or other written artefacts is an advantage.

Candidates must apply with a **project proposal** of max. five pages, including a half-page project summary, state of research, project description, methodology and schedule (excl. bibliography). Fluency in English and at least one East Asian language, both written and spoken, is required.

** Full-time positions currently comprise 39 hours per week.

Qualified disabled candidates or applicants with equivalent status receive preference in the application process.
